Hazard Identified? / Risks from it?	Who is at risk?	How are the risks already controlled? What extra controls are needed?	What has changed that needs to be thought about and controlled?
<i>Hazard – something that may cause harm or damage. Risk – the chance of it happening.</i>	<i>Young people, Leaders, Visitors?</i>	<i>Controls – Ways of making the activity safer by removing or reducing the risk from it. For example - you might use a different piece of equipment or you might change the way the activity is carried out.</i>	<i>Keep checking throughout the activity in case you need to change it...or even stop it! This is a great place to add comments which will be used as part of the review.</i>
Example: Hazard – fire Risk – smoke inhalation / burns	Leaders, Vistors, Young Leaders, Scouts	Smoke- Use of dry wood, check wind direction, Stand people out of smoke direction. Burns- Safe distance from fire, extra wood place on caefully, teach Scouts good practice around fires, burns/first aid kit easily avaiable.	
Weather, hot, cold, wet	All	Clothing to be suitable for weather. Suncream and hat. Warm hat and layers.	
Trip hazard	All	Ensure clear area for the activity.	
Injury or illness	All	First aid kit available. Suitable level of fist aid knowledge	
Hitting other people with gutter during activity	All	Clear instructions to be given at start of activity Adult supervision
